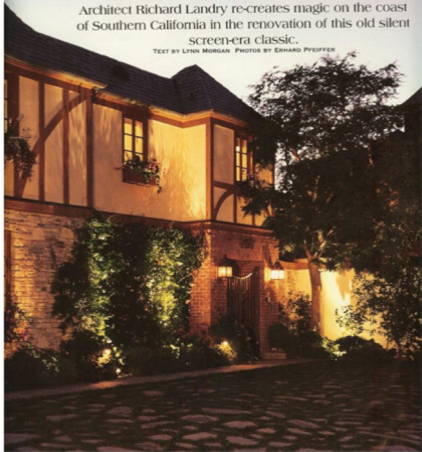


Tudor Revival Hollywood Style

Architect Richard Landry re-creates magic on the coast of Southern California in the renovation of this old silent screen-era classic.

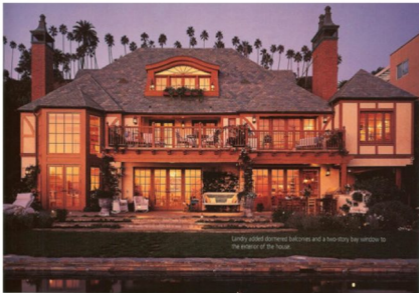


Architect Richard Landry, principal of the Landry Design Group, renovated this 1920s Tudor-style house in Los Angeles. Originally designed by architect John Beyer for movie mogul Irving Thalberg and his wife film actress Norma Shearer, the house received a new stone and brick facade, slate roof, and copper chimney cap during its extensive restoration and renovations.



In the courtyard facade, Landry added a dormered balcony, a two-story window at the main stairwell, as well as flower boxes at the eyebrow and casement windows. The landscaping gives a sense of an English country cottage. Right tip The courtyard balcony received new custom light fixtures. Landry painted the doors in a faux grain finish. Right bottom The attic was turned into a clubroom and has unobstructed views of the Pacific Ocean.
