"The landscape is full of grasses, shrubs, and those spectacular towering trees," notes Dick. "We utilized earthy tones throughout to integrate the interior with the exterior." 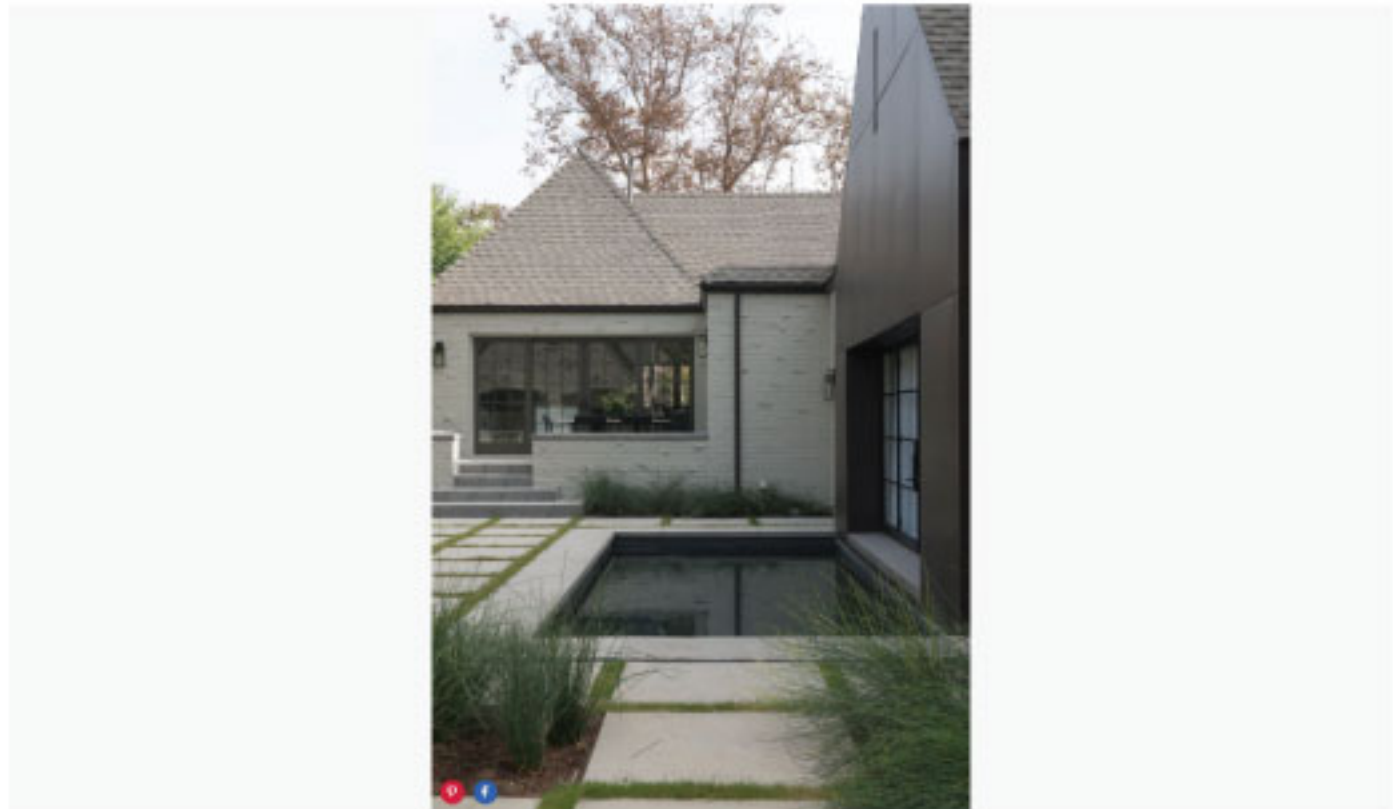


In the formal living room, the design duo brought in a split-level, leather-and-iron coffee table from [Casa Moby](#), a furniture company in Mexico. "It will age beautifully with loads, and provides lots of space for art books, pottery, and sculptures," says Dick. Two sofas—an upholstered piece by [Lacortte Furniture](#) (on the far left) faces a vintage sofa by Borge Mogensen—and a jute rug from [Decorative Curators](#) create the perfect spot to enjoy the fireplace, an architectural feature that is original to the house. A curious creation by New York artist [Ethan Cook](#), composed of handwoven strips of cotton and linen, sits on the mantel. "There is a lightness and spatial calmness to this work that we feel is reflected throughout the home," Dick explains.
