## Historical Charm

His first step was to create an exterior

that would blend with the neighboring houses. He relied on Santa Monica architect Ward Jewell for the floor plan and exterior design. Jewell even incorporated Michael's favorite early-20th-century architects—George Washington Smith, Wallace Neff, and Reginald Johnson—into the plan.

Michael already had an idea of appropriate building materials for his house, thanks to the original owner's 1920s Mediterranean home next to Michael's lot, which was actually a side garden the owner sold because he decided he didn't need so much space. Michael chose a six-color blend of clay







In the kitchen. Michael let go of his period criteria and created a state-ofthe-art cooking center. A pale vellow tile wall is the backdrop for a full-size. professional-grade oven, and dark green steel appliances. An island topped with honed marble stands at the center of the room. It looks "like a separate piece that's been bought and brought in-like felt like a natural part of the space." Michael says.

Upstairs in the master bedroom, a limestone fireplace adds Mediterranean style to the room, and light green plasterwork creates a serene and calming
