The dollar amount of the most talked about spec home in the country, which stands tall in Bel Air. "This home was curated for the ultimate billionaire who wants the best of everything," says developer Bruce Makowsky, the man behind **924 Bel Air Road** (924belair.com)—a 38,000-square-foot 12-bedroom and 21-bathroom house that comes fully furnished. Amenities include a 40-seat 4K Dolby Atmos movie theater, two fully stocked wine and Champagne cellars, a massage studio, a fitness center, three gourmet kitchens, five bars and even an 85-foot glass-tile infinity pool with a hydraulic pop-up theater screen. "I spend a lot of time on mega-yachts and private planes," says Makowsky. "People spend \$250 million on boats that they use for six weeks a year, and they have \$100 million private planes. ... It did not make sense to me that they live in \$20 million homes. I saw an opportunity to build homes for the superwealthy and to curate every inch of 924 Bel Air Road just like a mega-yacht."

ESTATE OF GRACE

Bragging rights aren't easy to come by in Beverly Park, the ultra-exclusive, paparazzi-proof and very gated hilltop Los Angeles enclave. But this home earns honors for having one of the larger lots in the area at almost 7 acres. Crowning the land is a 20,000-square-foot compound designed by starchitect Richard Landry. With 11 bedrooms and 18 bathrooms, the sprawling, contemporary home includes exceptional details like an entertainment pavilion connected to the main house by a steel-columned bridge, glass walls and water features throughout. A lap pool, plunge pool, paddle tennis court and mature landscaping are also found on the property, which is nestled into the hills and commands sweeping city views. Built in 2000, the home is just one of Landry's mega-mansions to be located in Beverly Park, the exclusive area that includes fewer than 100 residences.
